**Computer Internet Classes for older Learners** coming to Clarecastle in July **Age Action**, in partnership with Roche Ireland, is running a special beginner/refresher computer class (iPad/Tablet/Smartphones also) for people aged 55+ who have little or no computer experience. ## A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

**2 Cor 8:7.9.13-15**

You always have the most of everything - of  
faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of  
keenness for any cause, and the biggest  
share of our affection - so we expect you to  
put the most into this work of mercy too.  
Remember how generous the Lord Jesus  
was: He was rich, but He became poor for  
your sake, to make you rich out of his  
poverty. This does not mean that to give relief  
to others you ought to make things difficult for  
yourselves: it is a question of balancing what  
happens to be your surplus now against their  
present need, and one day they may have  
something to spare that will supply your own  
need. That is how we strike a balance: as  
scripture says: The man who gathered much  
had none too much, the man who gathered  
little did not go short.

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

**Mk 5:21-43**

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the  
other side, a large crowd gathered round him  
and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of  
the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by  
name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and  
pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little  
daughter is desperately sick. Do come and  
lay your hands on her to make her better and  
save her life.' Jesus went with him and a  
large crowd followed him; they were pressing  
all round him.

While he was still speaking some people  
arrived from the house of the synagogue  
official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why

put the Master to any further trouble?' But  
Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs  
and he said to the official, 'Do not be  
afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no  
one to go with him except Peter and  
James and John the brother of James. So  
they came to the official's house and Je-  
sus noticed all the commotion, with people  
weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He  
went in and said to them, 'Why all this  
commotion and crying? The child is not  
dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at  
him. So he turned them all out and, taking  
with him the child's father and mother and  
his own companions, he went into the  
place where the child lay. And taking the  
child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha,  
kum!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to  
get up.' The little girl got up at once and  
began to walk about, for she was twelve  
years old. At this they were overcome with  
astonishment, and he ordered them strict-  
ly not to let anyone know about it, and told  
them to give her something to eat.

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all things  
visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,  
the Only Begotten Son of God,  
born of the Father before all ages.  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God, begotten, not  
made, consubstantial with the Father;  
through him all things were made.  
For us men and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven, and by the  
Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin  
Mary, and became man. For our sake he  
was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he  
suffered death and was buried, and rose  
again on the third day in accordance with  
the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Fa-  
ther. He will come again in glory to judge  
the living and the dead and his kingdom  
will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spir-  
it, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds  
from the Father and the Son, who with the  
Father and the Son is adored and glori-  
fied, who has spoken through the proph-  
ets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and  
apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism  
for the forgiveness of sins and I look for-  
ward to the resurrection of the dead and  
the life of the world to come. **Amen.**
