



FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

This final Sunday of Lent presents us with the story of the raising of Lazarus. It is filled with passion and emotion and the bringing of Lazarus back to life is at the core of it all. The full story as told by John in his Gospel is well worth reading over slowly and carefully – it raises a number of questions; why did Jesus take so long to reach Bethany, why did he shed tears, why the interaction between Jesus, Martha & Mary?

It is not an understatement to say that this passage is one of the most dramatic in the Gospel of John. All this happens as Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem where he will be greeted in triumph and a short time after, meet his death. It is mirroring our own Lenten journey for next week we will celebrate that song of Hosanna as Jesus enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and then relate the story of his betrayal and death in Holy Week. What does it tell us about our lives and our faith?


Imagine if we hear someone close to us is ill, would we take our time on the journey to their side? These days if you don't respond instantly to a message or call, you get another one very shortly afterwards wondering what is wrong with

you, or maybe the other is angry that you are ignoring them.

How busy our life is, how little time we have to spend it with people who matter most; and in this Holy Week for us as Christians, no one matters more than Jesus. His life comes to a peak and then a seemingly bitter end before his own miraculous Resurrection.

The days of Holy Week are our time to accompany him, to let his life speak to ours, to let that which holds us back from truly living to die so that we may rise to a new life. All of this is happening is to result in God's glory.

On this final Sunday of Lent, as we step into Holy Week, it would be right and just to ask if what we have done throughout Lent and what we plan to do this coming week will be about our glory or the glory of God?





**A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans
 Rm 8:8-11**

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead

**A reading from the holy Gospel
 according to John Jn 11:1-45**

There was a man named Lazarus who lived in the village of Bethany with two sisters, Mary and Martha, and he was ill. It was the same Mary, the sister of the sick man Lazarus, who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped his feet with her hair. The sisters sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life.
 If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live,
 and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.
 Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'
 Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus wept; and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could

he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone.

Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:
 'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me. But I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice,
 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.' Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.

The Gospel of the Lord

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
 I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.
