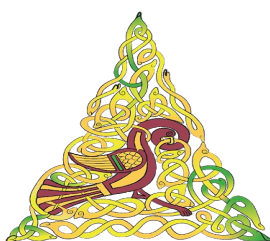

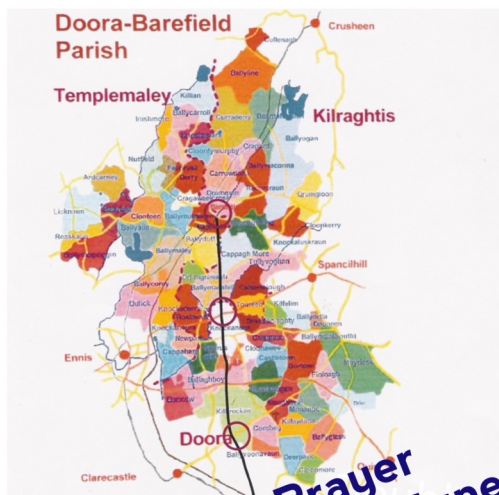

DO LOUGH DERG FROM WHEREVER YOU ARE—Three Day Pilgrimage on 27 – 29 June 2020 The Prior, Fr La Flynn, will do the pilgrimage on the Island during these three days. At the same time, a small number of our Lough Derg staff will be doing the pilgrimage in St. Mary's Church in Pettigo: this is the nearest church with a webcam to allow us to offer a live link in support of those who will choose to do the pilgrimage wherever they are. On Saturday 27th to Monday 29th June you go to www.loughderg.live to join the pilgrimage online. By way of support, we have prepared a Registration Pack. The pilgrimage will follow the traditional format, with a few practical adjustments. Please, be clear that this will not be a virtual pilgrimage. Following the death of someone close, we may experience strong and conflicting emotions. Anyone affected by grief is invited to view this pre-recorded talk, which is designed to give general information on grief and bereavement to bereaved people, their family and friends. Please allow yourself some quiet time to listen to the talk. It may be helpful to listen with someone else for support or, if that is not possible, to talk to someone over the phone afterwards. The information is recorded in two parts, which are approximately 35 minutes in total. Since we went to print last week the Government's roadmap to ease COVID-19 restrictions has changed in relation to the planned re-opening of Churches for attendance at Mass.

We will now be able to welcome people to weekday Mass from Monday 29th June. From Saturday 4th July and Sunday 5th July we expect to be able to welcome people to weekend Mass. This will have to happen within the terms of Social Distancing restrictions. Next week I will put forward some guidelines we will have to follow to do this safely with a document 'Let's keep our Sacred space a Safe place'.

I wish to thank you sincerely for your continued generous contributions to our Parish which are vital to the ongoing funding of our Parish services. To facilitate you paying your contributions we have now introduced an online service which is available on our Parish Website www.doorabarefieldparish.ie - click "Donate". This facility has three sections where you can donate an individual amount or choose an ongoing payment option.

The three sections are:

Parish Funds: These funds are for the day to day running of our Parish and supplements our weekly Basket & Development Fund collections.

Priests Collections: These funds go to paying our Priest with surplus going to Pastoral care in the Diocese. There are four collections annually and we will give you notice of upcoming collection dates.

Other Collections: These funds go to eight individual groups including Trocaire, Lourdes Invalid Fund etc. We will also advise you on these upcoming collection dates.

These are extremely challenging times for us all and while we are now asked to stay apart with social distancing we are a very strong community which is evidenced by the wonderful voluntary contribution and support of our Parish Clubs, Societies, and individuals. To all of you I say a very special thank you. Together we will see this through and be stronger and better people.

PROFESSION OF FAITH
