and spoken to him on his journey, and how

them, they became determined to kill him.
When the brothers
knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent
him off from there to Tarsus.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John Jn 15:1-8

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,
