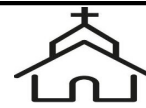

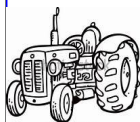

Last week we said goodbye to Sally McNamara, Sacristan at Church of the Immaculate Conception, Barefield for over fifty years.



Sally was a native of Ennis, born at Drumcliffe Road, daughter of Mary and Peter Cullinan. She arrived to Barefield in 1965 on her marriage to Francie McNamara.

From then on, she immersed herself in many aspects of Parish life. She became Sacristan at Barefield Church in the early 1970s and dedicated herself to that role until the recent past when ill health prevented her from continuing.

### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 10:46-52

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and  
a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son

of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at  
the side of the road.

When he heard that it was Jesus of  
Nazareth, he began to shout and to say,  
'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And  
many of them scolded him and told him to  
keep quiet, but he only shouted all the  
louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.'  
Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So  
they called the blind man.

'Courage,' they said, 'get up; he is calling  
you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped  
up and went to Jesus.

Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me  
to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said  
to him, 'Master, let me see again.'

Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved  
you.' And immediately his sight returned  
and he followed him along the road.

### The Gospel of the Lord

#### PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all things  
visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,  
the Only Begotten Son of God,  
born of the Father before all ages.

God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God, begotten, not
