Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) 24th July, 2022

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly

On Tuesday 26th July we celebrate the Feast of St. Joachim and St. Anne, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and grandparents of Jesus.

The Sunday before the Feast is now designated as World Day of Grandparents and our Elderly.

1. Make something special (e.g. a picture, a poem, a treat)
2. Ask them to pass on knowledge (learn to bake, cross-stitch, catch a fish, use a hammer)
3. Interview (ask questions about their lives)
4. Have a sleepover and watch a film together
5. Play cards together (ask them to teach you how to play cards)
6. Make a family tree with photos or hand drawn images of family members
7. Offer to do tasks around the house and garden
8. Create a card and tell them you love them
9. Share photo albums and tell the stories behind the pictures
10. Say a prayer together or ask them to teach you how to pray

On July 25th we welcome Fr Dariusz Zarebski from the Archdiocese of Miami, Florida who will be with us here in the parish for almost three weeks in the absence of Fr. Tom. Fr. Dariusz was born in Poland and ordained for the Salvatorian Fathers in 1990. In addition to Polish and English he also understands Russian.

From 1990 to 1994 he served as parochial vicar at several parishes in Poland. He then went to Canada, serving at various parishes there and working as a chaplain for young offenders until 1997, when he was named pastor of St. Ambrose in Coaldale.

From 1998 to 2006 he served as pastor of St. Peter's in Nanaimo, Diocese of Victoria; and from 2006 to 2010 he served as pastor of Holy Cross in Burnaby, Archdiocese of Vancouver.

Since arriving in South Florida in 2011, he has served at St. Ambrose parish in Deerfield Beach, where he is now the Pastor. We look forward to his visit and hope he enjoys his stay among us.

Sodom while Abraham remained standing before

doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the

Lk 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying,
and when he had finished, one of his disciples
said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John
taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this
when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy,
your kingdom come; give us each day
our daily bread, and forgive us our sins.

for we ourselves forgive
each one who is in debt to us.
And do not put us to the test." '

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a
friend and goes to him in the middle of the night
to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because
a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at
my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and
the man answers from inside the house, "Do not
bother me. The door is bolted now, and my
children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it
to you," I tell you, if the man does not get up and
give it to him for friendship's sake, persistence will
be enough to make him get up and give his friend
all he wants.

search, and you will find; knock, and the door will
be opened to you. For the one who asks always
receives; the one who searches always finds; the
one who knocks will always have the door
opened to him. What father among you would
hand his son a stone when he asked for bread?
Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you
then, who are evil, know how to give your children
what is good, how much more will the heavenly
Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!
