# **Signs and Symbols**

Language is a great tool of communication. Visiting a country where the language is strange, it can be very difficult to communicate with people and very often we feel completely lost. How happy we are when we meet someone who understands our language.

So important are signs and symbols, however, that perhaps only about twenty percent of communication happens through actual words. In the story of Pentecost we find two very powerful signs, wind and fire, both symbols of energy.

Still, language is hugely important to us. The Gospel tell us that at Pentecost everyone understands the Apostles. It wasn't that they spoke a completely new language, but one with which all are familiar, the language of peace!

### The Apostles spoke:

- \* of peace, rather than of war,
- Reconciliation rather than conflict,
- \* co-operation rather than competition,
- \* forgiveness rather than vengeance,
- of hope rather than despair,
- of friendship rather than hospitality.
- they spoke the language of unity rather than of division,
- the language of love rather than that of hate.

This "new" language gave rise to a community of faith and love, the community of those who believe in Jesus. Through the gift of the Spirit, people of many languages learned to profess the one faith to the praise and glory of God. That is the real miracle of Pentecost and it is a miracle which thankfully still happens.

#### Keeping it Real at Pentecost



They were amazed and astonished. "Surely" they said "all these speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God."
