What did Jesus tell his apostles to take with them? They were to go in the clothes they stood in, with nothing extra. Why did Jesus want them to do this? The most important things the apostles carried with them was the message that Jesus sent them with. This was the Good News that he had brought to share with the world, to lead people back to God's love and everlasting life. To love God and each other, to be forgiving and kind, and to live as Jesus had taught them. God would guide and look after them on their mission, taking care of all their needs. 
