ALL SOULS DAY

A TOWN CALLED NAIN

Nain is a town in modern day Israel situated on a hill overlooking the plain of Carmel, over the Nazareth Hills and in the distance is Tabor. Nain is about 30 minutes by car from Nazareth. And in today's gospel we find Jesus in the town of Nain where he encounters a funeral procession of a widow's son. What ensues is a moment of life transformation. A transformation experienced by the widow's son who is raised from the dead, the widow who is no longer alone having her son returned to her and the witnesses to this miracle are transformed by what they experience. The response to this miracle is one of praise: 'A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people'.

Today, in other parts of Israel and the Gaza strip the cry of the broken hearted fills the air. Death and destruction in an unimaginable scale has visited this land. The procession of funerals is endless and peoples' heartbreak is deep. One could well ask where is God in all of this?

Our answer may well be found in the readings from Isaiah and St. Paul's Letter to the Romans. In Isaiah we are reminded that:

'On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever'.

In St. Paul's Letter to the Romans we hear the reassuring words;

'Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us'.

Today, we need to hear the voices of great prophets once again. Prophets that cry out a message of hope for peace and reconciliation. As Jesus felt sorry for the widow of Nain may we feel the gaze of Christ on our world and hear his words 'Do not cry.' May peace reign in our world and in our hearts. And may our deceased loved ones exult and rejoice in eternal salvation.





A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans Rm 5:5-11

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit who has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful people. It is not easy to die for a good person - though of course for someone really worthy, a person might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 7:11-17

Jesus went to a town called Nain, accompanied by his disciples and a great number of people. When he was

near the gate of the town it happened that a dead man was being carried out for burial, the only son of his mother and she was a widow. And a considerable number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw here, he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry', he said. Then he went up and put his hand on the bier and the bearers stood still, and he said, 'Young man, I tell you to get up.' And the dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him to his mother.

Everyone was filled with awe and praised God saying, 'A great prophet has appeared among us;

God has visited his people.' And this opinion of him spread throughout Judea and all over the countryside.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty. maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
