
SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

We are constantly being told to prepare – the weather forecast tells us what to expect in rain, wind or whatever; plan for the exams, plan for retirement, prepare for the match. There are some things for which we cannot prepare – sudden bad health, an accident, the actions of others.

John the Baptist is the expert in how to prepare for a dramatic future event: the coming of the kingdom of heaven is his message. He says, "Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire". John's teachings are to the point and sum up the theme of preparation that is central to the Gospel of Matthew.

In Matthew's gospel there are numerous instructions regarding how we are to prepare for the final days and for eternal life. We are not only to hear Jesus' words, but we are to do them. We prepare for the coming kingdom by active obedience to the teachings of Jesus. Matthew's gospel features many parables that tell us to get ready, to be ready; the ten bridesmaids, the talents, the great feast and others. And here in Advent, John the Baptist is shouting it loudly but what we learn is that many will not listen to his instructions. In a way, we are being prepared for the rest of the Gospel and indeed life generally where people do not listen to that which will lead us on a pilgrimage of faith.

John also tells us the way *not* to prepare; by simply relying on our spiritual credentials. "We have Abraham as our ancestor" — this is the thinking that our unchanged rituals will do us fine. Presumably, relying on any other assurance or past accomplishment than God is not the way to prepare. Inaction is not the way to prepare. Making excuses is not the way to prepare. Being distracted from Jesus' coming kingdom by possessions, prestige, and power is not the way to prepare. Not then and not now.

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah Is 11:1-10

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict of hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land.

His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless, his sentences bring death to the wicked. Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips. The wolf lives with the lamb. the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together. The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobras hole; into the vipers lair the young child puts his hand. They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea. That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations

and its home will be glorious.

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing your name.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. Mt 3:1-12 In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'. This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:
A voice cries in the wilderness:
Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.
This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his

waist, and his food was locusts and wild

honey.

Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing- fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing- floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will
